The Easy Bib Home page (above)

How to use Easy Bib (or almost any online citation tool)

1. Select the right form – see the list above.
2. Fill in the form COMPLETELY – see three of the more common forms below.

Book: Name of the Author(s) (Editor), Title, Edition, Publisher, City, State, Year. For multiple authors, click on add at the right of the book contributors field.

Website: The article, document or page's title, authors (if named) or corporate/sponsoring organization, name of website, institution (such as a university), URL, date posted or published online & date you got it (accessed) it online.

 EasySyntax: Just fill out what you know. We'll format it correctly.

If you're done, we suggest you don't **cut and paste** directly. Instead, [export your list to Word](#) or [view it online](#).

Notice you have several choices now—

- If you have only one source and are done, choose export to word (better than copy and paste, because it preserves the formatting)
- If you have more sources, add another citation by choosing SAVE NOW. You can then add more sources and Easy Bib will help you put them into alphabetical order. HOWEVER, you will need to set up a free account to do this.
