Transfer Plan for the Liberal Arts Core

This sheet is designed for **students NOT planning to complete an Associate of Arts (AA) degree at Hawkeye Community College**. NOTE: Students completing the Associate of Arts degree WILL meet the UNI LAC requirements upon transfer with the following exceptions: A course in NON-WESTERN CULTURES (Category 2B) must be completed **either** at the community college or at UNI; CAPSTONE (Category 6) **must** be completed at UNI after transfer; Foreign Language requirement as described below.

Foreign language requirement (for students graduating from high school, or earning a GED in May 1989 and later). Two years of the same high school foreign language are required with C- or better in last term. Or the student may take two semesters of the same foreign language in college with a C- or better in the second term. This requirement may be met by FLS 151 Spanish I and FLS 152 Spanish II; ASL 131 American Sign Language I and ASL 161 American Sign Language II; or FLF 145 French I and FLF 245 French II.
