**NOTE: Psychology** majors must complete 9 semester hours of Psychology courses with 2.5 GPA or higher to be accepted. Students must achieve C- or higher in all Psychology courses applied toward major. Transfer students need permission of the Department head in order to declare a major or minor in Psychology.

\*Upper level Abnormal Psychology class will need to be taken at UNI.

**NOTE: Interior Design** students majoring in Interior Design at UNI must have a C- or better in all classes required for the major, whether taken at UNI or transferred from another institution. The student will undergo a portfolio review and interview, and must complete specified courses before they can officially declare this major.

**NOTE:** Students completing the **Associate of Arts** degree, following the specifications of the community college and meeting all conditions of the articulation agreement, will meet the UNI LAC requirements with the following exceptions:

1. **CAPSTONE** must be completed at UNI after transfer.
2. A course in **NON-WESTERN CULTURES** must be completed **either** at the community college or at UNI.

3. **FOREIGN LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT** (for students graduating from high school, or earning a GED in 1989 and later). Two years of the same high school foreign language are required with C- or better in last term. Or the student may take two semesters of the same foreign language in college with a C- or better in the second term. This requirement may be met by FLS151 Spanish I and FLS152 Spanish II; ASL131 American Sign Language I and ASL161 American Sign Language II; or FLF145 French I and FLF245 French II.
