Iowa Department Of Education

Last Thursday Provost LaGrone and Dr. Holcomb met with the Iowa Department of Education regarding our college's recent accreditation. The board voted to reaccredit Hawkeye Community College for another 5 years.

NAACEP and IAACEP

Hawkeye is hosting the National Alliance of Concurrent Enrollment Partnerships (NACEP) on Thursday. This is a national accreditation event. On Friday, the college will hold the first annual Iowa Alliance of Concurrent Enrollment Partnerships (IACEP) which is the state accreditation for concurrent enrollment program. There are over 168 registered, our own Sarah Topliff, Director of High School Partnerships has done a lot of work to get this event planned.

Board Education

<u>Enriched Quality of Life for Students – presentation by Mr. Norman Coley, Dean of Students</u>

Mr. Coley introduced himself as the Dean of Students. He gave a presentation on various campus life activities and student engagement opportunities, highlighting the impact on student experience at Hawkeye Community College.

Mr. Coley reported student activity goals include: collaboration and promotion with student opportunities, grow the civic engagement team and duties, develop a Hawkeye traditions challenge.

He said connection and experience is the core of student activities. Engaging with students and getting to know them is how to build connections and learn how to enhance their student experience at Hawkeye Community College.

Commencement is our greatest day of celebration, students share their story and celebrate their achievements. Commencement is something students look forward to. Participation is on the rise since the pandemic, last year 320 graduates walked.

Hawkeye has 27 Clubs with 4 categories. 13% of clubs are service based, the majority of clubs align with the student's program of study at 45%, hobby is second largest with 34% and 8% of clubs are honors.

Mr. Coley reported in the Fall of 2024 our clubs and organizations put on 22 community service events and collaborations. Our Student Leadership Council represents the college and the general welfare of the student body while helping provide and support student engagement opportunities on campus and the community.

Student Representative Reports - Ms. Evie Flint and Ms. Emma Schaffer

Ms. Schaffer gave an overview of her nursing classes. During her specialty clinical at Mercy, she participated in two mental health clinical rotations. In simulation clinicals, she managed three different patients, each requiring unique priority assessments before concluding the simulation.

In a clinical setting, she worked with a patient diagnosed with NSTEMI, a type of heart attack where partial blockage reduces oxygen to the heart muscle.

As part of the complex health alterations course, she completed case studies and pathophysiology reports focused on high blood pressure and pulmonary embolism. In the maternal-child health component, they developed an education and discharge plan for a new mother, addressing essential information for postpartum care and newborn care.

Additionally, Ms. Schaffer reported on Capstone, a comprehensive content review aimed at preparing nursing students for the ATI Comprehensive Predictor and the NCLEX-RN exam. The program emphasizes individualized study plans and regular assessments to identify knowledge gaps and enhance clinical knowledge.

Ms. Flint shared recent student activities on campus.

Students who participated in the Alternative Spring Break did community activities throughout the week of spring break. They made blankets for Friendship Village senior living specifically, the dementia unit, went to Northeast Iowa Food bank with the president and his cabinet, did rock painting with the local boys and girls club, served lunch at the Salvation Army Soup Kitchen, wrote encouraging messages and leaving

them with laundry kits at local laundromats in the Cedar Valley, spent time with the residents at Friendship Village Lodge, leading exercises, playing bingo, and gifting the handmade tie blankets they made previously, and delivered personal care kits to the House of Hope.

Hawkeye Community College hosted 150 high school students from 17 schools on the 13th for the second annual 'LooCon', an event exploring information technology careers like cybersecurity. Students attended panels led by IT experts from Mayo Clinic, Arctic Wolf Networks, VGM Group, Inc., ProCircular, and NewBoCo. Students also participated in a "Capture the Flag" cybersecurity competition to test their skills in identifying and mitigating security threats.

Ms. Flint also gave an update on RedTail athletic programs. The first home softball game took place today, where the team faced Mount Mercy at 4 pm. Additionally, the soccer program has made a significant change by hiring a new men's head coach, who will start next Tuesday. This move marks a positive step toward separating the men's and women's programs, allowing for more focused training for each team.

The RedTail sports shooting team had an impressive performance at the 2025 Collegiate Clay Target Championships. Chase Bindl secured first place in Sporting Clays (Class B) and second in American Skeet (Class AA). The team placed second in Division IV Doubles Trap with 462 combined targets, third in Division IV Super Sporting with 448 targets, and hit 477 targets in Division IV American Skeet, with Chase achieving 100 Straight.

In wrestling, several athletes competed at the NJCAA Wrestling Championships this month. Alyson Krum made an outstanding showing, competing for the national championship in the team's first season, and the women's team had one All-American this season.

The Track and Field teams also had a strong showing, with eight members competing at Indoor Nationals. Three new school records were set: Nathan McFarland in the high jump (2.04m), Aldaine Angus in the long jump (7.43m), and Ryan Leonard in the heptathlon (3840 points). The team also celebrated having one track and field All-American.
